To Have and To Hold the said tract of fifty acres of land more or less unto the said Andrew Briggs his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby warrant and forever defend the said land and premises unto the said Briggs from any Person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Appeared before me William Johnson and made oath that he saw Allen Johnson sign seal & acknowledge the within Bill of sale to Lewis Bledsoe and Stephen Johnson, sworn to before me this 31<sup>st</sup> day January 1810.
