The State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina Greenville District, Personally came Joel E. Know all men by these presents that James Kilgore of Greenville district State aforesaid for and in consideration of Thirty Dollars to me paid by George Rop of the state and district aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell & Release unto the said George Rop all that plantation or tract of Land, containing nearly two acres more or less, the same being granted to William Johnson the 6<sup>th</sup> of January 1794: situate in the State and district between Enoree River & Brushy Creek - bounding by lines running N.W. by S<sup>c</sup> George Rop's land N.E. by Richard Kemp's land, & S.E. by land belonging to the heirs of Moses Kemp deceased, Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the s<sup>c</sup> premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have & To Hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George Rop his heirs & assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all singular the premises unto the said George Rop his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs, & against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness my hand & seal this 15<sup>th</sup> of August 1810 & in the thirty fifth year of the independence of the United States of America - Signed Sealed & Delivered in the presence of William Pedman
