

Francis and Catharine the following property, to wit. to Francis I give three feather beds and furniture, two large basons, six pewter plates, two dutch ovens, two Iron pots, half dozen knives & forks, & two Cows & Calves, to Catharine I give one sorrel stud horse colt, one grey horse, one sorrel mare, one pine chest, half dozen earthen plates, one Skillet, six glass bottles, six pewter spoons, one Jug; To Have & To Hold the above mentioned property unto the said Francis & Catharine Pickett their heirs and assigns for ever -

And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend the said property unto the said Francis & Catharine Pickett their heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof -

State of South Carolina Greenville District; Know all men by these presents that Joseph Woods for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars to me paid by William Malin of the State and District aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold and Released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Malin a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the district aforesaid on the waters of St. Jeger river, Beginning on a pine on Doct Nelsons corner and running thence with his line N. 40 E. 38. ch. 50 links to a post oak, thence S. 50 E. 26 ch. 50 links to a lightwood stake thence S. 40 W. 38 ch. 50 links to a stake on Moses Woods line thence with his line to the Beginning. Containing by estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less, the same being part of the S. end of a tract of land containing 1542 acres granted to Maj: Carson, by Patent bearing date the second day of June 1788. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments & appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To Have & To Hold the above mentioned
