

against myself and my heirs and assigns and against every other person  
whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.  
Witness my hand and seal this fourth of February Eighteen hundred &  
Eight and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & seven  
and in the thirty first year of the sovereignty and Independence of the  
United States of America - Signed Sealed and Delivered in

one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by George Spillers of the same place  
Have granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do  
grant bargain sell and release unto the said George Spillers a tract or planta-  
tion of Land it being a part of a tract originally granted to George Seaborn  
and conveyed to S. Roark lying being in the district State aforesd. on the waters  
of Maple Swamp. Beginning on a black oak 34 runs N<sup>o</sup> 35 W. 25 ch. to a post oak 77  
thence S 65 W. 18. 60 links to a pine 31 bounded on both lines by Isaac Cox, then N<sup>o</sup> 23  
ch. to a black oak 31, then E 45. 50 to a stake, then E 36. 50 links to a Spanish oak 31  
thence S 34 W. 67. 00 to the Beginning, including one hundred and ninety two acres  
more or less, Together with all and singular the right, members hereditaments  
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining
