The State of South Carolina, Greenville District. Know all men by these presents
that I Thomas Easley of the district and State aforesaid, for and in consideration
of the sum of Eight hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Capt: Samuel
Towns of the same place, I have granted bargained sold and released and by
these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel Towns the four
following described parcels or tracts of land, to wit, one tract containing Sixty seven
acres more or less, originally granted to John Hunt, conveyed to me by James Cooper the 15th of
October 1806, lying on the waters of Saluda River, Beginning on a stake corner running
thence N. 22 E. 32 chains to a stake thence N. 68 W. 30 ch. to a stake thence S. 27 E. 7
ch. to a red oak thence S. 16 E. 20 ch. to a post oak, thence S. 30 E. 10 ch. to the beginning
also one other tract which I purchased of Jacob Light the 14th day of January 1805, containing
one hundred and thirty six acres, adjoining the above tract, Beginning on a white oak
corner running thence N. 45 E. 7 ch. to a post oak thence N. 67 E. 23 ch. to a spanish oak, thence
N. 35 N. 24 ch. to a post oak thence N. 3 E. 34 ch. 450 links to a post oak, thence S. 77 W. 5 ch.
to a post oak, thence S. 17 N. 44 chains & 50 links to a black oak thence S. 50 W. 30 chains
to a stake on the river thence down the meander of the river to the Beginning
also one tract which I purchased of Thomas Cooper by deed bearing date the 7th day of
February 1805, originally granted to Daniel Bush containing one hundred & sixty five acre
adjoining the above, Beginning at a bush on the bank of Mill Creek, running thence N. 65 W. 5
chains to a stake by a black gum in part of the said tract, thence S. 64 W. 26 chains, running thro'
part of the same tract to a stake in the old line, thence S. 35 E. 16 chains, 50 links to a plumb
tree, thence S. 20 E. crooping mill creek, 27 ch. to a dogwood thence N. 70 E. crooping
the creek in two places 29 chains, 75 links to a Post oak, thence N. 15 W. 25 ch. 25 links, to a
Post oak, thence N. 15 E. 26 ch. 16 links, to a Red oak, thence N. 50 W. 22 chain, 50 links, to a
conditional Red oak on the East branch of Mill Creek, thence down the said branch
as it meanders to the Beginning, also one other tract adjoining the above containing
Forty three acres, Beginning on a white oak, thence S. 80 W. 12 chains to a spanish oak
thence S. 50 W. 11 ch. to a white oak, thence N. 10 W. 25 chains, crooping mill creek
above the mill pond to an ash in a branch, thence up the said branch taking the
Right hand fork, to James Coopers spring, thence S. 82 E. 6 chains to a Post oak, thence
S. 20 E. 23 chains to the Beginning, Containing in the whole four tracts four hundred and
Eleven acres, be the same more or less, Together with all and singular the rights mem-
bers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or
pertaining, To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Towns
his heirs and assigns, forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Samuel Towns his heirs & assigns, against
myself & my heirs & against every other Person or Persons, who in ever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any
