Know all men by these presents that for the natural love and affection that I bear for my son Thomas Edwards, and more especially for the sum of five shillings to me in hand paid by the s^d Thomas Edwards the receipt of the same is acknowledged Do grant bargain and sell all my right and title to the land whereon he now lives which I purchased of Langston the land lying on both sides of Porcum branch and the head Waters of Recklent Creek containing three Hunner Acres more or less Beginning on a post oak next a pair of Race paths running thence N^o 35 E 300 Poles to a Stone Corner between a Spanish Oak White Oak & red Oak thence S^o 60 E 140 Poles to a Post Oak Corner thence S^o 108 Poles 8 links to a stake at the road near a branch thence up the S^o Branch 118 Poles to a Post Oak thence S^o 12 E 42 Poles to a red Oak thence S^o 16 E 168 Poles to a Chimney thence S^o 37 E 94 Poles 70 links to a Hickory Corner thence N^o 50 W to the Beginning containing three Hunner Acres more or less as willfully appears by the old Deed which land I give granted and sold unto my son Thomas Edwards & his heirs for use and as warrant and defence to s^d land from me and my heirs forever given under my hand and seal this the fullenth day of May 1811 in presence of Samuel Fear & Lemuel Gardner John Edwards
