hundred Dollars to me paid by Rev F. Ross of the distict aforesaid HAVE
granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant
bargain sell and release unto the said Rev F. Ross a tract or parcel of land
laying and being in the distict aforesaid on the N. side of S. Pacolet River
Beginning at an ash on the south side of the River a south course from the
mouth of the branch that S. Easley's still house is on, thence up the several
meanders of the River to the ford called the wagon ford near William Camrons
house, thence South 41 M^o. 5 Chain to a white oak stump near the ridge road thence
S. 86. M. 11 Chain to a hickory, thence N. 2 M. 7 Chain 50 Lbs to a black oak thence
N. 5 M. 9 Chain to a stake near the Ingeloo road, thence S. 4 Ch. 50 links to a black oak
Bates corner, thence N. 5 Ch. with his line to a black oak thence N. 31 Ch. 50 Lbs
to some black oak saplings on Moses White's line, thence N. 72 E. with his line & Ch.
to a maple on the creek, thence up the meanders of the creek to a white oak
thence N. 70 E. 10 Ch. to a post oak thence N. 10 M. 7 Ch. 50 links to a post oak
thence E. 19 Ch. 50 Lbs to an ash on the still house branch thence down the meander
of the branch to the Beginning, Containing one hundred acres be the same more or less
