The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I Solomon Hornbuckle of Greenville district and state aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred dollars to me in hand paid by John Mayfield of the State and district aforesaid Have granted bargained sold and by these presents Do grant bargain & sell unto John Mayfield a tract or parcel of land supposed to contain one hundred acres more or less Situate in the district aforesaid on the north side of Enoree River. Beginning on the N^o bank of said River at a water oak thence N. 5 E. 7 to a sweet gum on a branch thence up said branch 19 chains & 50 links to a maple thence along Mayfield's line 50 chains to a pine corner thence N. 58.25 to a stone corner on the old Indian line,
