sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Love at and
before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt of which the
said James Barton doth acknowledge and thereof and of and from every part
and parcel thereof doth acquit and discharge the said Samuel Love his
heirs and assigns and for divers other good Causes and Considerations hereunto
moving have granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and Confirmed and
by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and Confirm unto
the said Samuel Love his heirs and assigns forever part of a certain Tract
of Land containing nine hundred and seventy acres originally granted unto
the said James Barton and signed by his Excellency William Moultrie on
the fourth day of March 1793. Situate in Greenville County Washington
District on Horsepen Creek the waters of Enore river Beginning at a post
Oak Corner of part of the same tract laid off for Josias Fowler running
