The condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bound William Richards his certain attorney his heirs executors administrators or assigns shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Henry Benson his Ex<sup>r</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> or assigns on or before the first day of October next three hundred and fifty seven dollars and fifty cents with lawfull interest thereon from this date, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue
