Know all men by these presents that I John Croft of the district of Greenville in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and thirty Dollars to me in hand paid by James Stamford of the district and state aforesaid, Have granted bargained and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James Stamford a certain of one hundred and fifty acres of land more or less lying in the district aforesaid and on Reedy River it being part of two tracts originally granted to Louis Swall the first for two hundred acres the other for four hundred and forty acres now the said One hundred and fifty acres of land more or less is laid out unto the said James Stamford as follows. Beginning on a black oak corner near and above John Croft's field on the original line and running N.W. 25° 24' chains to a pine log corner, thence N.E. 65° 21' chains to a pine tree N.W. 25° 15' Ch. or 5.0 links to a stake corner in William Ray's field on said Ray's line, near and below where Swall's house formerly stood thence East on said Ray's line to Reedy River crossing the same thence running down the said River on the East side with the intention to a winter oak corner on the south bank of said River thence on a conditional line to the Beginning including one hundred and fifty acre of land more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the said one hundred and fifty acres of land more or less with the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said James Stamford his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises unto the said James Stamford his heirs and assigns forever against myself and my Heirs and against every Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this Eighteenth day of April one thousand Eight hundred and twelve, signed sealed & delivered in presence of Pascal Dacus, Philip Chambers Jun.
