Earle a Negro girl named Mary, about sixteen years of age of a dark complexion, being the same girl which I lately sold at Sheriff's sale as the property of Julius Nichols, by virtue of an execution issued from the Clerk's office of said district, against said Nichols; and purchased by James Benson, and sold by said Benson to me the S. Wood - Herely warranting the said girl to be sound healthy and sensible, and a slave for life - And will defend the said negro girl & her future increase unto the said Elinor K. Earle her heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs, and every other person or persons whomsoever - Witness my hand and seal this twenty first day of November anno Domini 1812

I know all men by these Presents that I David Goodlett of Greenville District and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the natural Love & affection that I have for my grand son David Johnson Goodlett, of the district & State aforesaid, Have, gifted granted, and released, and by these Presents doth gift grant and release unto the said David Johnson Goodlett, all my Lands lying on the South side of Richland Creek it being part of two tracts of land one originally granted to myself, and what I bought of Levi Howell containing the Plantation whereon Iesse Goodlett now lives, supposed to contain one hundred and eighty acres, be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, thenceunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Johnson Goodlett his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs or executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the aforementioned David Johnson Goodlett his heirs and assigns against myself, my heirs and assigns, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming a to claim the same or any part thereof.
