South Carolina, I know all men by these presents that I Stephen Langford of Tennessee in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Enoch Brinston of South Carolina & Greenville district have granted bargained and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Enoch Brinston all that tract of land being in the district of Greenville on South Santee river, begining on a white oak on a conditional line made between Robert Nelson and Martha Langford, running thence North 50th to a Stone corner, thence S 55 W 26 to a White Oak thence W 126 ch. to a white oak, thence S 40 W 106 ch. to a pine thence S 50 E. to a poplar on the conditional line, on a branch thence down the meander, of S. branch to the river and then along the conditional line to the beginning corner, Containing One hundred and fifty acres, by estimation, be the same more or less. the same being part of a tract of land granted to Robert Nelson - Together with all & singular the rents, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Enoch Brinston, his heirs and assigns forever, & I do hereby bind myself my hair, executors, administrators and assigns to warrant & defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Enoch Brinston his heirs & assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person or persons,
