and singular the goods and chattels and Estate house hold furniture pots, Coony
dishes and plates and all other furniture hereunto belonging too tedious to
mention also all stock of cattle and hogs and fowls also all my working tools,
also I the said wife of the said Philip Sane Elizabeth Sane do freely voluntarily
relinquish all my part and Dower of said Estate unto said daughter Elizabeth Sane
without dread or fear of him or any other person or persons whomsoever we and
each of us do acknowledge the same without any condition, I say given by us
and from under our hands, and seals, and acknowledged in the presence of us.
