

State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Elizabeth Green of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of one hundred & five dollars to me in hand paid by John Green of Greenville District in the State aforesaid Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Green all that tract of land lying & being in the State and district aforesaid on the North side of Maple Creek waters of Enoree River being a part of a tract of land originally granted to Margaret Cook Beginning on a Black gum corner & on the north side of the said creek near the mouth of a small branch which is a dividing line between the lands of Elizabeth Green & Joshua Cox Pruning up said branch following the meanders to a maple & on Bowen & Buffin line thence S. 55 E. five chains to a red oak & thence S. 25 W. 40 chains to a dogwood & thence S. 53 E. 3 chains fifty links to a maple corner & on the north side of Maple Creek thence running up said creek following the meanders to the Beginning gum corner which includes the whole land to be conveyed amounting to forty two acres be the same more or less Together with all and singular the rights members here ditto & appertaining to the said Premises belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said John Green his heirs or assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors administrators to warrant & forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John Green his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and no further — And as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the thirtieth day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & twelve, and in the thirty seventh year of the Independence of America. —

Tyger river it being part of a tract of land containing in all Three hundred acres originally granted to Patrick Shaw as for further particular reference can be had to his plat & grant one hundred
