


212 I know all men by these Presents, that I Moses Wood of the State of South Carolina and Greenville District for the inconsideration of three hundred and forty dollars to me in hand paid by William Wood of the District and State aforesaid have bargained sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto William Wood two Negroes (viz) One Negro girl about seven years old named Kate, at two hundred dollars, and one Negro boy named Ben about two years old at one hundred and forty dollars, which Negroes I do warrant and forever defend unto said William Wood his heirs executors, Administrators and assigns for ever against myself my heirs executors administrators and assigns or any other person whatsoever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of July 1812.



Know all men by these Presents that I James Kilgore of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of one hundred and thirty dollars to me in hand paid by Clement Homer of the State and District aforesaid, I have granted bargained and sold, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto Clement Homer his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and thirty nine acres, it being a part of a tract of seven hundred and twenty two acres originally granted the said James Kilgore, Situate in the State and district aforesaid on both sides of the long branch, waters of Gibsons Creek, Beginning at a black gum corner on the N^o side of said branch, and runs N. 20 W. 12.50 to a Stake corner, then S. 70 W. 51 Ch^s to a Post oak corner, thence S. 30 E. 35 to a Stake corner, on Solomon Jones' line thence on said line N 70 E 31 to a Post oak corner on the south side of said long branch, thence N. 29 W. 12 to a maple corner, on the bank of S^o branch, thence down the meanders of said branch to the beginning black gum. which includes the land to be conveyed. Together with all & sing^l -lar the rights, members, heirs, tenants, and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise incident or appurtenant, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Clement Homer his heirs executors administrators and assigns against myself my heirs, Executors, and administrators and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In Witness my hand and seal this 26 April 1805, and in the 29th year of the Independence of the United States of America.
