James Ross of Greenville District & State aforesaid in consideration of the  
sum of one Hundred Dollars paid by Hardy Forrest of the District aforesaid  
have Granted bargain & sold and released and by these presents do Grant  
bargain sell and release unto the said Hardy Forrest all that Tract or  
parcel of Land lying and being in the District aforesaid on the waters  
of Muske creek a branch of Socchee Tyee River Beginning at a White Oak  
thence N. 40. E. 44. to a Gum corner thence N. 10. W. 25 to a pine corner  
thence S. 55. W. 44. to a Stake corner thence S. 20. E. 66 to the beginning  
corner containing one hundred & Twenty six acres be the same more  
or less it being Granted to James Nicol by a patent bearing date the  
fourth day of May one thousand seven hundred and Eighty five  
Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and  
appurtenances to the saids belonging or in anywise incident or appurte-  
nating to have & to hold "all" and singular the premises before mention-  
ed unto the said Hardy Forrest his heirs & assigns forever And I do hereby  
bind myself my heirs Executors Administrators & assigns to warrant &  
forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said Hardy  
Forrest his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs & against every other  
person whomsoever claiming or to claim any part thereof in witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July one thousand  
Eight Hundred & Thirteen. <sup>1813</sup> James R. Ross J.P.
