I, Paschal Smithson of Greenville District and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of seventeen hundred dollars to me paid by Samuel B. Hill, of Augusta the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, I have granted bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Samuel B. Hill his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or plantation of land, supposed to contain four hundred acres, be the same more or less, two hundred acres of which was originally granted to John Peak the 6<sup>th</sup> day of February 1786 and recorded in Grant book H H H H, the balance being part of two tracts, the one a part of a tract of six hundred & forty acres originally granted to John Mitchenson the 17 day of March 1787 & recorded in grant Book W. W. W. page 42. & conveyed by S. Mitchenson to J. Dacus 29<sup>th</sup> Oct<sup>r</sup> 1803. & from S. Dacus to James Kilgoor the 18<sup>th</sup> day of January 1812. the remainder being part of a tract of five hundred & thirty one acres Conveyed from Joshua Owen to James Kilgoor the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of May 1806 situated on both sides of Gilders Creek waters of Currie river including the Plantation wherein John Dacus Sen<sup>r</sup> & Sons formerly lived, also a grist mill and all the appurtenances thereto belonging, Beginning at a sweet Gum 3+ 0m for John Mitchenson, thence on Andrew M. Gray's line \$35 E 55 to a Pine 3+ thence \$15 W. 26 to a P. Oak 3+ 0m on the South side of Austin Waggon road thence up the meanders of said to Nathaniel Dacus line, thence South on S. line to Gilders Creek, thence down the meanders of said Creek to an old line made for John Peak thence on said line \$15 E. 6.50 to a Stake 3+ 0m, thence South 72 E. 33.60 to a Post oak 3+ 0m on arch. Lester line, thence on S. line N. 12 E 50 to a red o 3+ 0m, North side of Courthouse road, thence N.W. on S. road to a fork near the corner of Dan Beachams fence, thence on an old road Northward to Dan Beachams red oak corner thence on S. Beachams line N. 66 E. 25 to a S. 3+ 0m, thence a direct line to the beginning gum corner which includes the full land to be conveyed, be the same more or less —
