Samuel Earle his heirs and assigns forever. All that tract or parcel of land containing  
one hundred and sixty one acres, be the same more or less, agreeable to the original  
Survey thereof; granted to the said "John" Wilson Newby the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 1799 Situated  
in Greenville district on the banks of Dog river beginning on a Post Oak running S 85 W  
50 to a Stake, then E 5 W. 16 to a Stake, N. 65 W. 23.40 to red oak S 25 W. 35.50 to red oak
