





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The State of South Carolina, Know men by these presents, that I William Harbin of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of fifty pound Sterling to me in hand paid by James N. M. Cray of the State & district aforesd. I the said William Harbin hath granted bargained sold & released, & by these presents do grant bargain & release unto the S^r. James N. M. Cray all that tract or parcel of land, containing two hundred and thirty six acres, better or same more or less inclosing that tract where William Cray formerly lived the same being a part of a tract of 1262 acres of land granted to Battle Birdsong in the year 1791, the said Birdsong conveyed 300 acres 1262 acres tract to James Saterfield on the 2^d of March in the year 1795, and the same parcel of land conveyed from said Saterfield to William Harbin, and said Harbin hath conveyed 64 acres of said land to William Vaughan bearing date the 10th of June 1799. now the land to be conveyed to S^r. James N. M. Cray from said Harbin is all that Deeded in the conveyance above mentioned from Birdsong to Saterfield except the above mentioned sixty four, conveyed from S^r. Peck to S^r. William Vaughan, be the same more or less - Situate in the State & district aforesd. On the north side of Gilkes Creek, bounded on the right side by land granted to Archer Atkins, on the West by John Hutchison's land, on the south by the aforesd 64 acres conveyed S^r. Vaughan, & the S^r. Peck, own land, on the east by said James N. M. Cray - Together, with all and singular the Rites members heretofore, and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James N. M. Cray his heirs & assigns, forever. And I the said William Harbin do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James N. M. Cray his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness my hand and seal this 4 day of December 1805, & in the 29 year of the independence of the United States.

Elias Green Cooke all that tract or parcel of land, left to me by the last Will and testament of my Father Middleton Prater deceased, being part of the land whereon he said Middleton Prater formerly lived in Greenville district, on the waters of the north fork of Saluda river, beginning a post oak at the head of a hollow near the road leading from the house wherein the said Middleton Prater then
