day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifteen. The Condition of
the above obligation is such that if the above bound Samuel Richards his heirs Executors
or administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said
George W. Earle his certain attorney his heirs executors administrators or assigns the just &
full sum of Six hundred and twenty six dollars, with lawful Interest thereon
from the Date, on or before the first day of July next, without fraud or delay
then this Obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force & Virtue.
