Witness my hand and seal this 7th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Ten, and in the thirty fourth year of the Independence of the United States of America

Know all men by these presents that I William Lee of Greenville District in the State aforesaid in consideration of two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by James Holland of the State and district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released & by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James Holland a Plantation or Tract of land containing two hundred acres, (be the same more or less) Situate in Greenville District lying on Little Horse Creek, beginning on a Dogwood 3^t running thence N^o 21 E^o 45° 50' on Benjamin Townsend line to a red Oak 3^t, thence N. 65 W 26' to a red Oak 3^t on Thompson Butler line, thence S 5 W 17° 30' on said line to a red oak 3^t thence N. 85 W 75° 50' on S^t Butler line to a Stake 3^t, thence N. 61 E^o 95' on W^t Cokers line to the beginning. Being part of a tract of eight hundred and forty two acres, of land originally granted to Mr Wood on the first day of May 1786. Together with all and singular the rights & members hereditament and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Holland his heirs and assigns for ever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said James Holland his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand & seal this first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred and six in the thirtieth year of the independence of the United States of America.
