to hold the said piece parcel and tract of land with its appurtenances, unto the  
said Humphry Cobb his heirs and assigns forever as fully & absolutely as  
the said Thomas Payne as Sheriff aforesaid might, could or ought to  
grant, bargain and sell the same, by virtue of the Statute aforesaid, and the

of Greenville district, and State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereras by virtue of a  
Writ of fieri facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas, held for Greenville  
District, less the first monday after the fourth monday of March in the year  
four thousand one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, at the suit of Asa Moore  
against Lee Floyd, otherwise called Levy Floyd, to me directed, commanding  
me that of the goods and chattels lands and tenements of the said Lee Floyd to
