Earle, and also in consideration of one thousand Dollars to me paid by the said Robinson M. Earle HAVE given granted bargained ~~and~~ sold and released, and by these Presents do give grant bargain sell and release convey and confirm unto the said Robinson M. Earle those several tracts pieces or parcels of land following, to wit, Five hundred acres (be the same more or less) Situate in the district of Greenville on the Saluda river Originally granted to Isaac Brown, the 21st of January 1785 and conveyed to me by him the 4th of October 1787, beginning at a Beach Corner on the bank of S^o fork of Saluda running thence East 35 chains to a Post oak, thence S 45 E 25 ch. King the N^o fork to a Red Oak, thence S 33 W 90 ch. crossing the North fork to a Post Oak on the bank of the S^o fork, thence up the meanders of the same to the beginning. ALSO a tract of two hundred and fifty acres (be the same more or less) Situate on the East side of the N^o fork of Saluda adjoining the above, being the same that was conveyed to me by Col. Henry M. Wood the 9th day of January 1800, as may appear by his deed on Record in the Clerk's Office of Greenville district in book E page 442 being part of three Surveys, one granted to H. M. Wood one to Joseph Dunn & one to William Wright. ALSO one other tract or parcel of land, adjoining the first containing one hundred and fifty eight acres, being the same that was conveyed to me by John Jones the 7th of October 1802 as may appear by his deed on Records in the said Clerk's Office, book F, page 550, Situate on the West side of the N^o fork of Saluda river, being part of three Surveys, one granted to H. M. Wood, one to Joseph Dunn, and one to Isaac Brown. ALSO one other tract or parcel of Land contain- ing two hundred and eighteen acres, more or less, Situate on both sides of the N^o fork of Saluda river adjoining the first tract, and being the same that was conveyed to me by William Laffoon the 16th day of November 1805, as may appear by his Deed to me on Record in the Clerk's Office, book E page 325 & 326 being a tract originally granted
