the State aforesaid in consideration of one hundred and seventy dollars to me in hand paid by
Jeremiah Cleveland of the State aforesaid aforesaid have granted bargained sold & released and
do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland a
lot of land in the village at Greenville Courthouse supposed to contain about one third of
an acre be the same more or less lying to the south of Dr. Crittenden lots and being the south end
of two lots known and distinguished by the place or street of the said village by the numbers
one and six (1 & 6) and a fronting fifty two and a half feet on the north east corner of
public square Beginning on a stake running thence at 15° E. 52' feet to a stake thence
15° E. 26' back to a stake thence 15° N. 52' feet to a stake on the side of the street above
and thence 15° N. 200' feet to the beginning which lot or parcel of land was conveyed
from David James Fletcher to David Henning on the twenty ninth day of June in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen then conveyed from David Henning
to the said Jeremiah Cleveland the seventh day of October 1815. Together with all & belonging
thereunto hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging
in any wise incident or appertaining to same & to hold all and singular the
foregoing before mentioned unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland his heirs and assigns forever
and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and
forever bind all and singular the said premises unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland
his heirs and assigns against myself & my heirs and against every person whom
ever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. —
Witnesseth my hand and seal this seventh day of October in the year of our Lord
