This Indenture made this Eighth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and ninety one and in the fiftenth year of the Independancy of the United States of America between Joseph Wood all of the State of South Carolina and County of Pendleton of the one part and Samuel Walker of the State aforesaid and County of Greenville of the other part Witnesseth that whereas by a certain grant bearing date the seventh day of February 1780. one thousand seven hundred and ninety one from ~~under~~ the hand of his Excellency (Charly Pinckney) Esq<sup>r</sup> Governor and Commander in chief in and over the State aforesaid for that purpose appointed did give and grant unto the said Joseph Woodall a certain tract a parcel of land containing fifty six acres situated in the district of Ninety six on Rowley Crute waters of Chowan having such shape and form boundaries and boundings as by a plat thereunto annexed doth appear which grant being recorded in the Secretarys Office grant book C. N<sup>o</sup>. - reference being thereunto had may more fully appear NOW this Indenture witnesseth that the said Joseph Woodall for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five Pounds Sterling to him in hand well and truly paid the receipt
