white oak on famols branch thence S 60 W 15 to a poplar thence N 45
E 28 to a white oak on Horse creek thence down said creek S 69 E 14 5/10
to a black oak on Robert Bollings line thence S 55 E 17 to a black oak
thence S 45 W 9 to a stake then breaking off from the creek by a straight
