The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents, that We
William Bowen of Laurens district in the State aforesaid, and Horatio
Griffin of Greenville district in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration
of the sum of six Hundred and sixteen dollars to us in hand paid
by John S. Bulow of the City of Charleston in the State aforesaid, have
granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant
Bargain sell and Release unto the said John S. Bulow, all
those several plantations tract or parcels of lands lying and being
in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid one tract or parcel
of land lying and being on the waters of Bushy Creek of Coosaw
River containing two hundreds and eleven acres to the same
more or less being part of two tracts of land originally granted to George
Lewis & Moses Lewis the grant to George Lewis bearing date the 7th
day of March 1796 and the grant to Moses Lewis the 7th day of
December 1795. then conveyed from the said Moses Lewis to George
Lewis and from Geo. Lewis to Aaron Kemp and from the said
Kemp to Levi Howell and sold by the Sheriff of Greenville
district as the property of the said Levi Howell to the said Bowen and
Griffin — Also one other tract of land lying and being on the waters
of Prince Creek containing two hundred acres be the same more
or less — Beginning on a post oak running thence S. 55° E. 41 chains to a
hickory stake thence N. 30° E. 42 chains 50 links to a Spanish oak
thence N. 60° W. 01 chain 50 to a stake thence S. 44° chain to the
beginning — being part of a tract of land originally granted to
George Brundidge, containing in the whole four hundred and
eleven acres, be the same more or less. Together with all and
singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to
the said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining
to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned
unto the said John S. Bulow his heirs and assigns forever, and
we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to
warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises
unto the said John S. Bulow his heirs and assigns against ourselves &
our heirs and against every other person or persons whom ever lawfully
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness our hands
and seals this twenty seventh day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, and in the
fourth year of the American Independence Wm. Bowen and H. G.
