the love and good will which I have and bear for my five sons  
Isaac Pace, Richard Pace, John Pace, Jeremiah Pace and  
Twitty Pace, as well as in consideration of the sum of five  
dollars to me in hand paid by my five sons, Isaac Pace, John  
Pace, Richard Pace, Jeremiah Pace & Twitty Pace aforesaid  
the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, Have given granted  
and set over and by these presents do give grant and set over  
unto sons, Isaac Pace, Richard Pace, John Pace, Jeremiah  
Pace and Twitty Pace aforesaid their heirs, and assigns forever  
four negroes to wit one negro woman named Betty, one  
negro girl named Milly, one negro girl named Dice and  
one negro girl named Betty, together with their and every of their  
future issue and increase to be equally divided and possessed by  
my five sons aforesaid after my death and not until that  
event takes place in the following manner that is to say my  
son Jeremiah Pace allowing in his share fifty dollars for a  
horse which I gave him, and my son Twitty Pace allowing in  
his share one hundred and fifty dollars for land by me given  
him - and cash paid for him. And I do hereby disallow and make  
void all former gifts and promises of gifts that may have been made  
or pretended to have been made to any persons in person or otherwise  
of the property above mentioned or any part thereof. In Witness whereof  
I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this sixteenth day of  
September in the year of our Lords one thousand Eight hundred &  
sixteen signed sealed and delivered in the presence of.
