Whereas by virtue of an order issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the said district, tested the second day of November in the year of our Lord in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifteen at the suit of Robert Alexander (one of the heirs of James Seaborn dec'd) against Mary Seaborn (the widow) by a Writ of Partition, which said order directed that it should on the first Monday in January then next ensuing, after having given lawful notice thereof, proceed to sell the lands of James Seaborn dec'd so receivable to the return of the Commissioners, in convenient Lots or Plantations, upon a Credit of twelve months; and that the money arising from the said Sale be divided between the parties interested pursuant to the Act of Assembly &c.
