This Indenture made this 12th day of October 1818, between William Howard of State of South Carolina and Greenville district of the one part, and Timothy Pitman of the State and district aforesaid of the other part, Witnesses, that for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty dollars to him in hand paid by the said Timothy Pitman the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged; hath bargained sold and delivered, and by these Presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the s^d Timothy Pitman his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land Situated lying & being on the head branches of Tiger river, it being a tract of land granted to W^m Howard bearing date 31st of August 1814, having such shapes and marks, as follows, Beginning on a Chestnut thence S 41 W. 21. to Hickory, thence S. 75 W. 22 to red Oak thence N. 40 W. 23 to a Chestnut thence N. 54 E. 82 to a Stake, thence S 22 W. 47 to the beginning Containing 167 acres, be the same more or less, together with all and singular the rights & premises to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises to the ~~people~~ use and behoof of him the said Timothy Pitman his heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and for ever defend from myself my heirs and assigns, and from any other person or persons lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof. J. Culbertson, containing one hundred and thirty five Acres Situate in Greenville district on the branches of Green, Creek of South Carolina, Beginning at a Chest. + 3 & Chest. Oak + 3 on a high mole of a hill and runs N. 50 E. 35 to a Stake thence S 87 W. 38 to a black Gum, thence N 15 W 22 to a black Oak thence S 69 W. 49 to a Stake, thence East 18 to a Red oak & Locust thence S 62 E. 50 to the beginning. Bounded on the first line by land Surveyed for Robert Goodings S. N. & N. W. by land Surveyed for Ben. Huddleston. S. E. by land Surveyed for Brasell E. & S. E. by land Surveyed for John Dawson.
