Cooke of the one part for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand dollars to me paid by by Alfred Wistar & Joseph Star of the other part all of the district aforesaid has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, and release unto the said Alfred Wistar & Joseph Star all and singular a plantation or tract of land situate in the said district on the middle fork of Saluda containing one thousand acres be the same more or less. Beginning on a small spring at the upper end of the lower plantation & to run so as to include a spring thence strait to a chestnut sprout near a tan trough, thence to a pine 3x Hardins, 3x thence with Hardins line to a Branch thence up the branch to David Deylons line thence with Deylons around the west side of his land to a pine 3x on the path leading from Deylons old house to John Lovels thence square across to John Lovels line thence with his line to a stake 3x thence to a
