Dill all that tract or parcel of land in the District of Greenville aforesaid on wild cat creek a branch of south Tyger river beginning at a Chestnut a corner made for Robert Carter the line S. 14th E. to a chestnut thence N. 75th E. to the creek thence up with the meanders of the creek to Carter's line & thence S. 62th W. with Carter's line to the beginning containing by estimation thirty four acres be the same more or less the same being the S. W. of survey granted unto James Gray by partition bearing date 18th January 1790 for two hundred and a fifty acres also another parcel of land joining lands of the above survey sold to Robert Carter beginning at a post oak Carter's corner thence nearly a N. east to a red oak a conditional corner near the Suncum road thence with Solomon Dill line to a Spanish oak near the mill pond and then with Dill's line to Carter's line to a stake & thence to the beginning supposed to contain ten acres the same being a part of a survey granted to Samuel Shaw & known by hold tract together with all & singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any way appertaining to have & to hold all & singular the premises before ment ioned unto the said Mr. S. Dill his heirs & assigns for ever & he he by bind my self my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant and defend all & singular the sd premises unto the said Mr. S.
