the receipt I do hereby acknowledge. Have gran-
ted bargained, sold released conveyed and confir-
med and by these presents do grant bargain
sell and release convey and confirm unto the
said Micajah T. Smith his heirs and assigns
all that plantation tract or parcel of
land containing by estimation five hundred
acres be the same more or less. Situate lying
and being in Gunville District aforesaid on
both sides of the middle fork of Saluda River
and the waters thereof and runs as follows -
that is to say beginning on a Poplar Daniel
Mcjunkins Corner thence North thirty three
degrees east thirty two chains to a stake thence
thence South thirty seven degrees East six chains
to a chestnut, ~~thence~~ North sixty seven degrees,
