Know all men by these presents, that I Jeremiah Cleveland of the State and district aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of ninety seven dollars to me in hand paid by John Blasingame, of the aforesaid State and District have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain, sell and release unto the said John Blasingame all that tract or parcel of land containing four and $\frac{3}{4}$ acres being part of a tract of land originally granted to John Mcquinn, situate lying and being in the District and State aforesaid, on a branch of the Golden Grove Creek a water of Saluda River, Beginning on a red oak $\frac{1}{2}$ m. thence N 45 W 20 ch 26. lin. to a persimmon $\frac{1}{2}$ m. Standing on the south bank of said branch bounded by land belonging to Silas Hollaway thence down the meanders of said branch to a white oak $\frac{1}{2}$ m. Standing on the south side of said branch, bounded by land belonging to me
