 assigns all her Right and Claim of dower and also all her Right
 and Interest or Claim or to all and singular the premises without
 mentioned and released Given under my hand and seal this
 twenty eighth day of February 1824 and in forty eight year
 of the independence of the United States of America

 Parish of the State of South Carolina & District of Greenville of the one
 part & Charles Bryant of the State and district aforesaid of the
 other part witnesseth that the said Bonnette Parish for and in
 Consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars, lawful money
 to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 hath bargained and sold & by these presents doth bargain & sell
 release & confirm unto Charles Bryant forever all that plantation
 or tract of land containing One hundred Acres it being a part
 of a tract of 337 acres originally granted to Edward Howard
 by Patent bearing date 22 January 1795 & recorded in Grant book
 No. 5 page 179 and was sold unto Bonnette Parish & recorded
 in Book H. page 146 situated in Greenville District & State aforesaid
 on the branches of Reeds Creek to be conveyed begins as follows viz:
 Beginning at a red oak 3x. for P. tract & Runs W. 32. ch to a Post Oak
 3x. thence S. 35 to a pine 3x. thence E. 33 to a Spanish oak 3x. thence N. 31.
 to the beginning red oak corner which includes the quantity of land
 to be conveyed of the said Bonnette Parish as the Covenant & agree
