Ligon and Elizabeth Ligon, of the said state and district, and for and towards the better support and maintenance of them after my decease and for divers other good causes and valuable considerations hereunto especially moving have given granted and sold and by these presents do give grant and sell unto the said Nancy T. Ligon, and Elizabeth Ligon, one negro wench named Lucinda To have and to hold the said negro wench here by granted bargained and sold unto the said Nancy T. Ligon, and Elizabeth Ligon their executors, administrators, and assigns as their own proper Negro from henceforth for ever may have hold and enjoy the same to their own proper use and behoof as they shall think fit in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this Twenty sixth day of February one thousand Eight hundred and twenty five last. South Carolina personally came John T. Ligon before me and in Greenville Dist ^{made} oath that he saw Blackman Ligon sign seal and acknowledge the within as his acting due for all the property there in mentioned & at the same time he saw John Turner together with himself sign his name as a subscribing witness to the due execution of the same sworn & subscribed to this ^{7th March 1825 before Jno. South Carolina Know all men by these presents that Greenville District I Arthur Clark of the state and district aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of nine hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by Charles Garrison, of said state and district have granted bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Charles Garrison, all that parcel or tract of land containing three hundred acres, more or less situated on the north side of Saluda River in the state and district aforesaid, beginning at a Red oak corner on the bank of said River running S. 70° E with my own line 7ch to a Red oak corner thence S. 59°
