The State of South Carolina Greenville District know all men by these presents that I Jacob Ford, of the district State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by John Hightower, and Joseph Goodwin, of the said state and district Have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Hightower, and Joseph Goodwin all that plantation tract or parcel of land, situate lying and being in the district and state aforesaid, on the North fork of Saluda River, containing fifty acres be the same more or less, it being a part of a tract of land willed to me by my Father John Ford and sold by me to my brother Levi Ford bounded on the north and East by the Land that I sold to the said John Hightower, and Joseph Goodwin on the South by the old line on the west by land now belonging to John Cox, and the River, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Hightower, and Joseph Goodwin, their heirs and assigns forever against Bailey Butler, Lewis Kirkpatrick,
