

waters of Ruddy River it being part of a tract of three hundred & thirty acres more or less leased to me for twenty five years, by John Black, Treasurer of the Wards worth Poor schools, by deed bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 1818 laid out originally to Peter Brooks the said one hundred acres being the same purchased by Josiah Timchur as are specified in a bond from Pleasant Sullivan to S<sup>r</sup> Timchur for title, and survey by Dr. Griffith for said Timchur & Sullivan and having such lines and marks as are represented in S<sup>r</sup> Griffith's plan of survey which said tract of one hundred acres, was contracted by said Teacher to said Mcneely, and is to include the whole improvement plantation & buildings of the said Mcneely, where he now lives, and his lease is to be considered as complying with the said contract of said Sullivan with said Timchur, I having purchased from said Sullivan & agreed to confirm the title to said Timchur to have & to hold the said one hundred acres unto the said David Mcneely, his executors administrators & assigns for and during the time of seventy five years from & after the twelfth day of December eighteen hundred & fifteen and I the said Thomas G. do hereby covenant with the said David Mcneely that he his executors, administrators, and assigns may and shall peaceably and quietly occupy hold and enjoy the said one hundred acres forever during the said term without lawful let suit interruption of me the said Thomas G. or any other person whomsoever according to the true intent & meaning of these presents, be the said Mcneely, rendering and paying the yearly rent of one barley eom in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this ninth day of -
