 Sheriff for said district. Gentlemen I have received
 under the will of Micajah Pickett Deceased -
 sundry amounts which in the negroes as will appear
 in the Ordinarys Books say for \$15 or 1600 also
 Land as you have sold for \$650. or near that
 amount also one thousand dollars from Jephtha
 Pickett which in the whole will amount to near three
 thousand two hundred and fifty dollars which I
 have received under said will. I have also conveyed
 the negroes which I received under the will of the deceased
 and have received others in exchange which is
 at this time executed and in the possession of the Sheriff
 which is one negro man by the name of Sam and
 a woman by the name of Martha and her child Mary
 which Negroes Sam and Martha and her child Mary
 you or either of you will sell as the estate of Micajah
 Pickett deceased to satisfy the decree which Kezannah
 Pickett obtained vs. a Grant, Hiram Whitted Esq
 and others, and you will sell the negroes say Sam
 for cash and Martha and her child on a credit
 until the first of January one thousand eight hundred and
 Twenty seven with the lawful interest from the date of the
 sale. And you or either of you are hereby authorized
 and directed to retain all the amounts of the sales of the said
 negroes until a general and final settlement of said
 decree and this is hereby my or des. or a resignation to the same
 as witness hereunto I doth set my hand and seal this the 20 of
