

This indenture made this third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and One and in the Twenty sixth year of the independency of the united States of America between Samuel Brasher Planter of the State of South Carolina and Greenville District of the one part and John Brasher planter of the State and district of one said of the other part -

Witnesseth that the sd Samuel Brasher for and in the Consideration of the Sum of two hundred dollars To him in hand paid by the said John Brasher the Receipt whereof is here by acknowledged have Granted bargained, allined released and confirmed and by these presents doth Grant Bargain sell alien Release and confirm unto the sd John Brasher in his actual possession now being by virtue of a bargain and deal to him thereof made forever from the day of the date here of and by force of the Statute for transferring use in to Possession and to his heirs and assigns forever all that Plantation tract Or parcel of land containing one hundred and Twenty six acres be the same more or less it being Part of that tract of land originally Granted to James White containing five hundred acres situate in Sixty six district, now in Greenville district On both sides of Cripple Creek of Eddy River near the head of sd Creek West the old Indian boundary bounding s. to. on Land laid out for William Ford fall over sides by the east Land Granted by His Excellency Benjamin Guerard Esquire Governour and Commander in Chief over the said State at Charleston the patent bearing date the twenty first day of January anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Three and in the ninth year of the Independency of the united States of America said Land being duly conveyed to Thomas Brasher and Recorded at Greenville Court house in the Book page 184 & 185 said Land being part of sd tract and willed to sd Samuel Brasher by his father Thomas Brasher beginning at a dogwood and running thence s. 25. w. 53. to a red oak thence s. 65. E. 21. 40. to a red oak thence
