 their heirs forever with the future increase of the females and we  
 Bend ourselves and our heirs to warrant and defend all the said  
 negroes against ourselves and our heirs and every other  
 person whomsoever claiming or to claim them or any one  
 of them witness our hands & seals the 6 April 1826

 bout sixteen years of age and I do hereby bind myself my  
 Heirs Executors Administrators and assigns to warrant and forever  
 Defend unto the said Robert & Perry the property unto them their  
 Heirs and assigns for ever and I do further warrant the said negro to  
 be sound and free from all complaints what so ever given under  
 my hand and seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day of November 1826
