


The United States of America. To all whom these letters Patent shall come Whereas Thomas Key a citizen of the United States hath alleged that he has invented a new and useful improvement in the mode of letting Water on Water wheels which improvement he states has not been known or used before his application hath made oath that he doth verily believe that he is the true inventor or discoverer of the said improvement; hath paid in to the treasury of the United States the sum of thirty dollars delivered a receipt for the same and presented a petition to the Secretary of State signifying a desire of obtaining an exclusive property in the said improvement, and praying that a patent may be granted for that purpose These are therefore to grant according to law to the said Thomas Key, his heirs and executors or assigns, for the term of fourteen years from the eighteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty six the full and exclusive right and liberty of making Constituting using and vending to others to be used the said improvement a description whereof is given in the words of the said Thomas Key himself in the schedule hereunto annexed, and is made a part of these presents Testimony whereof I have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the United States to be hereunto affixed Given under my hand at the City of Washington the eighteenth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty six and of the Independence of the United States of America the fifty first John Quincy Adams.
