3x and runs S.70.E. 23 chains to a Spanish Oak 3x thence N.15.E. 17 chas to a post oak 3x thence N.75.W. 45.50 -
to a Stake 3x thence S.18.W. 25 post oak 3x the 156. E. 3.25 to the Beginning corner. containing forty five acres
Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments & Appurtenances thereto belong-
ing or in any wise incident or appertaining. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors adminis-
trators & Apigns to warrant & forever defend all and singular the aforesaid described land unto
