 corner thence eastwardly on Thomas meadows line to a post oak
 corner thence southwardly on said Roberts line to a post oak et
 c. thence eastwardly to the beginning the said land being apart of and the
 the east end of a survey laid out to said Springfield being one hundred
 and ten acres more or less with all and singular the rights hereditaments
 & appurtenances therunto to have and to hold all & singular the premises before
