John Shumaker of Greenville District & State aforesaid have bargained & sold & by these presents do grant, bargain sell & release unto Little Berry Rutledge of the State and district aforesaid all that part of a tract of land granted to Dr. Lawrence Beacher by his Excellency Charles Pinckney on the 24<sup>th</sup> of November 1807. Containing two hundred and nine ty four acres the part to be conveyed, part of the above contains one hundred and ninety four acres more or less being laid out to the said Little Berry Rutledge as follows Beginning on a sappias corner on Joseph Rutledge, line & running on the original line of said land N. 40. W. to a stake thence on an original line Aquilla Beachers line S. 75. W. 40 to a hickory thence S. 40. W. 27. to a stake S. 55. E. to a maple corner made between Lawrence Beacher & Joseph Jackson thence on a conditional line thence D. Survey to the beginning excluding by Estimation one hundred & ninety five acres more or less. Together with all and singular the Rights, numbers & hereditaments, & appurtenances there unto belonging or in any wise incident thereto to the said Little Berry Rutledge his heirs and assigns for ever & I do hereby bind myself, my heirs Executors &c to warrant and for ever defend the Rights of the said land to said L. B. Rutledge his heirs Executors administrators or assigns against myself, my heirs &c or against any other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof —
