 Facias issued out of the Court of Common Pleas held for the
 of Greenville and dated the thirtieth of October in the year of our
 one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven at the suit of Edmond
 Madolill and others to me directed, commanding me that of the goods and
 lands and tenements, of Paschal Rutledge to levy the sum of six hundred dollars
 damages and costs, I have seized and taken of the land and tenements of the
 Paschal Rutledge all that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, containing
 hundred acres more or less where he lives situate and being in the district of Greenville
 it being part of two tracts originally granted to Lewis Duwall on Ruddy River
 ing at a Black Oak corner near and above John Crofts field on the original
 and runs N.E. 65° 24 Chains to a Pine log corner N.E. 65° 21 Chains to a Pine tree
 N. W. 25° to a Stake corner on William Rays fence thence a long the said fence
 towards the River to a Post Oak thence East on sd line a cross the Ruddy River
 to a Post Oak thence East on sd line a cross the Ruddy River to the East Bank
 thence running down said River on the East side with the meanders to a
 Post Oak on the west Bank of the said River thence on a straight line to the begin
 and whereas the said premises, with their appurtenances, since the seizure by me
 by virtue of the said writ of Fieri Facias before mentioned have been exposed
 to sale at public Vendue, and purchased by Philip C. Lister of the District
 of Greenville for the sum of six hundred & thirty five dollars being the highest
 sum that was bid therefor: Now know ye that I Nimrod Underwood
