 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that I have granted
 Bargained, sold Aligned conveyed and released and by these pre-
 sents do grant Bargain sell Alim convey and release unto the said
 Thomas Howard of the said State and District a parcel of land con-
 taining One hundred acres be the same more or less it being a part
 of a certain Grant of Six hundred and forty acres of land gran-
 ted to John Redman by his Excellency Benjamin Guinard Esqr.
 on the 21st of January A. D. 1785 of which two Hundred and
 twenty acres was conveyed to David McDavid and from him
 to John Howard Sen. & from the said John Howard made
 over by a will to Joseph Howard lying on the high bank
 waters of Eno Run River above the ancient boundary line the
 said one hundred acres beginning on a Gum Original corner
 running N. 37° chains to a Spanish Oak thence N. E. 35° chains to a
 Black Gum corner bounded on Goldsmiths land and
 others thence W. 40° chains to a Pine corner near the head
 of the branch thence running with the various courses
