 in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold, all and
 singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said Bluford
 Dyer And I do hereby bind myself & my heirs, Executors and administra-
 tors to warrant and for ever defend, all and singular the said premi-
 ses, unto the said Bluford Dyer and his heirs and assigns, against
 myself & my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my
