 And by these presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said George
 Dill a certain tract, parcel, piece of land situate in the district and state
 aforesaid that is to say on the North side of St. Tyger River beginning at
 a Sweet Gum 3x on the River bank thence N. 74 E. 5. 78. to a small white
 Oak 3x thence to a hickory N. 16. E. 67. 20. to a Stake 3x in William Nelsons
 field N. 74 W. 66. 70 to a Stake 3x in a wagon road thence N. 16. W. 9. 33.
 thence N. 65. W. 12. 1/2 to a hickory 3x thence S. 25. W. 32. 30 to a forked Maple
 3x on the River thence down the meanders of the River to the begining
 sweet gum corner & grante to a resurvey of the said land made by
 James Whitten Esqr on the 22 day of March 1816 he went annexed and the
 land now intended to be conveyed was originally granted to Thomas
 Davis & by him conveyed to Sulcer & wife, John Gauvin and by him willed
 to me and name from me to George Dill as a reference to the said
 John Gauvin will and to the several conveyances will more fully appear
 or Containing four hundred and thirty two acres but the same more
 or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments
 and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident
 or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises
 before mentioned unto the said George Dill his heirs and assigns
 for ever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors and Administrators
 to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said
 premises unto the said George Dill his heirs and assigns against me
 and my heirs or any person or persons lawfully claiming, or to claim
 the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this thirty first day
 of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and twenty seven and in the fifty first year of the United States of
